# SOUP KITCHEN: 8,836 SETS OF FOOD DISTRIBUTED

Our resilience shone through despite the challenges of June. Unpredictable heavy rains and disruptions to the water supply threatened to hamper our street distribution operations. Thanks to our dedicated volunteers and quick-thinking measures, we were able to continue our work and honour our commitments to the clients. While there were minor incidents on the streets, such as harassment, our volunteers remained unfazed, staying focused on the true vision of our cause: 'Hunger Knows No Barriers.' Through it all, our volunteers and supporters exemplified the true spirit of community!





### **MEDIC: XX STREET CASES ATTENDED**

In June, the need for wound dressing among our clients reached an all-time high, highlighting a crucial area of concern. Our medical team has been working tirelessly to meet these demands while also emphasising the importance of empowering clients to care for their wounds independently.

We focused on helping clients attend dressing appointments and learn basic wound care, reducing their reliance on our medical team. By fostering self-care and responsibility, we aim to extend our support to even more people in need, while promoting long-term health and well-being.





#### **WELFARE: 13 CASES WERE ATTENDED**

Over the years, through our food distribution in Pudu, we have identified an increasing number of clients suffering from chronic cataracts in need of immediate attention. Recognising this, addressing it has become a top priority for our Client Case Officer before the condition worsens further.

What keeps us inspired are the stories we bring back, like that of a homeless client who secured a job and housing, allowing him to live away from the streets. Positive news like this motivates us to keep striving for a brighter future for everyone.



# FOOD BANK: 1,001 DRY FOOD PACKS DISTRIBUTED, 44.371.29 KG SURPLUS FOOD RESCUED

In June, our community support efforts received incredible contributions from various organisations, reflecting the spirit of giving that drives our mission. Etika Sdn. Bhd. generously donated 100 cartons of Lipton Tea, which are currently being distributed to our beneficiaries. Country Farms Sdn. Bhd. made a substantial impact with their donation of 3,172 cartons of CHI Forest Sparkling Water, totaling 76,128 cans, which have already benefited over 63,000 individuals in need.













The support went beyond donations, with valuable volunteer efforts from Persatuan Belia Perkampungan Permatang Tinggi in Penang, who assisted with distributing dry food donations. Meanwhile, in Ipoh, the Rotaract Club from Universiti Teknologi PETRONAS not only contributed dry food supplies but also helped clean our Food Bank, demonstrating their commitment to our cause.
