KSK Society has been serving the marginalised community in Malaysia since 2008. These communities include the homeless, urban poor, and Orang Asli population. Our services can be broadly categorised into three departments: Soup Kitchen, Food Bank, and Empowerment. Within these three departments, there are subdivisions of services that aim to help various vulnerable demographics of Malaysians. These include off-the-street programmes for homeless clients and education for Orang Asli children.

## Nurturing Hope Amidst Adversity: Our Endeavours to Serve the Needy Community in 2022

KSK Society was able to produce an output that was five times greater than the amount of donations received. This means that for every RM1 donated, RM5 worth of items were contributed to the beneficiaries.

## General Update

### Expansion and reorganisation to benefit more

This year, we expanded our current team to increase capacity in operations, marketing, public relations, and administration, in order to cope with the increasing needs and number of beneficiaries in the underserved community.

We welcomed Miss Elisa Khong, who first volunteered with us 15 years ago when she was a teenager, as our Group Managing Director. Justin Cheah, who served as our Operations Director for many years, assumed the role of Marketing Director, while Mingwen, who previously interned with KSK Society back in 2014, has taken on the role of Operations Manager.

Looking to the future, we have many plans for further expansion and growth. With our expanded team (including new staff members in Penang and Ipoh), we are confident that we can continue to make a meaningful impact in the lives of those we serve.

### Expanding Our Services to Benefit More Underprivileged Individuals in Ipoh

In July, with encouragement from a generous benefactor, Mr. Andy Ooi, KSK Society established a hub in Medan Bendahara, Ipoh. With the establishment of this new hub, we aim to provide even more comprehensive assistance to the local underprivileged community, after having established a surplus food programme there in 2017. Since its establishment, 50 needy families and 40 homeless clients have been receiving consistent food assistance through our food bank and soup kitchen programmes.

### New Home, New Opportunities: KSK Society's Penang Team Moves to Lorong Carnarvon

After 11 years of serving the community from Halaman Ariffin, KSK Society's Penang team has found a new home in Lorong Carnarvon, thanks to the incredible generosity of an anonymous couple who offered two newly refurbished units for free to enhance our current soup kitchen and food bank operations.

This new location has proven to be more convenient for our regular clients, who now find it easier to walk to. Looking ahead, KSK Society's long-term plan is to establish an empowerment programme at the new location, enabling us to provide even more support and help those in need. We are excited about the opportunities this new home will bring and grateful for the support of our anonymous benefactors.





## Partnerships and Collaborations

At KSK Society, we are privileged to have forged numerous partnerships and collaborations with esteemed corporations and learning institutions, all of which have helped us to serve the community more effectively. We recognise the importance of working together, to avoid duplication of efforts and resources, and to maximise our impact. We are grateful for the opportunity to provide a platform for all groups who share our commitment to making a positive difference in the lives of those in need.

In 2022, we were fortunate to collaborate with several outstanding partner, including Lotus's Stores Malaysia Sdn Bhd, AEON Co. (M) Berhad, Universal Robina Munchy's, Nestle Malaysia, Unilever and other generous individuals, to raise over 15,000 kilograms of dry provisions for "World Food Day." We also participated in the regional food drive campaign "Drive Hunger Away 3" organised by The Food Bank of Singapore, together with seven sister food banks in Asia (members of the Global Foodbanking Network), namely: Feeding Hong Kong, Green Food Bank of China, Scholars of Sustenance Thailand and Indonesia, Food Cycle Indonesia, and Rise Against Hunger Philippines.



In addition, we worked with AEON BiG, Airdry Apparel Sdn Bhd, HSBC Malaysia, Lazada, Shopee Mobile Malaysia Sdn Bhd, Sutera Mall Johor Bahru, TedBoy, The Alice Smith School Foundation to raise awareness and hold food drive campaigns.



We are especially proud of the long-term volunteering partnership programme we established with UCSI University. These partnerships have been instrumental in helping us achieve our goals, and we are grateful for the support and collaboration of our partners.

## Soup Kitchen

Reduce homelessness and poverty, through giving cooked food and community care

As a soup kitchen that has been providing vegetarian food as well as basic medical and welfare assistance to our clients since 2008, we are dedicated to serving every individual in need with the ultimate goal of helping them to lead a better life, away from homelessness.

Total new clients registered : 592



## Soup Kitchen

While food and basic necessities are crucial to address their immediate needs, they also serve as a tool for our team to connect with them more closely and provide the best solutions to their predicament. KSK Society currently provides 16 meal services on a weekly basis across its four hubs in Kuala Lumpur, Penang Island, Ipoh and Johor Bahru.

Thanks to joint efforts within our community, the number of homeless individuals on the streets has greatly reduced over the years from 1,800 individuals in 2010 to approximately 700 in 2022. Nevertheless, we know there is more work to be done to improve the situation even further.



### Increased serving capacity in key areas

Since the pandemic, we have identified a growing number of jobless elderly and visually impaired individuals who are in need of food. They live in partitioned rooms in slum areas and have no means of income. In response to this, we have increased our serving capacity in identified areas such as Pudu and Brickfields with the specific aim of targeting these vulnerable groups. The Covid-19 pandemic has had a devastating impact on their lives, and our focus is to identify and provide assistance to even more individuals in need.



I am a blind person and work as a masseuse for a living together with about another 100 other blind people in Brickfields. It was a tragedy to us during the pandemic period as we had to close down, and there is no other source of income due to our disability. Fortunately, KSK came in to help us by providing regular food assistance regularly which we are very grateful for. We have definitely benefited from their kindness and we have also gained courage from the fact that people care. On behalf of the hundreds of blind people whom I represent in Brickfields, I would like to give a quote by Sir Winston Churchill, "Never have so many owed so much to so few."

### Festive Treats

KSK Society has been distributing specially prepared meals, called Festive Treats, during festive celebrations like Chinese New Year, Hari Raya, Deepavali, and Christmas to our friends on the streets. These meals are valued at RM20 per pax and serve as a significant act of kindness towards those who are often ignored and excluded from such celebrations. Although these special meals may be a small gesture, we hope they bring comfort to those who have nowhere else to turn.



### Self Care Pack

We are pleased to share that, with the help of generous public donations, we were able to raise a total of RM50,000 to purchase 1,000 sets of self-care packs for our friends living on the streets. These packs contain essential items such as toothbrushes, toothpaste, mosquito coils, medicated oils, carrier bags, face masks, warm meal sets, and Kechara Empowerment cookies, and were distributed across our hubs in Johor Bahru, Kuala Lumpur, and Penang. Our clients were pleasantly surprised by the thoughtful gifts.

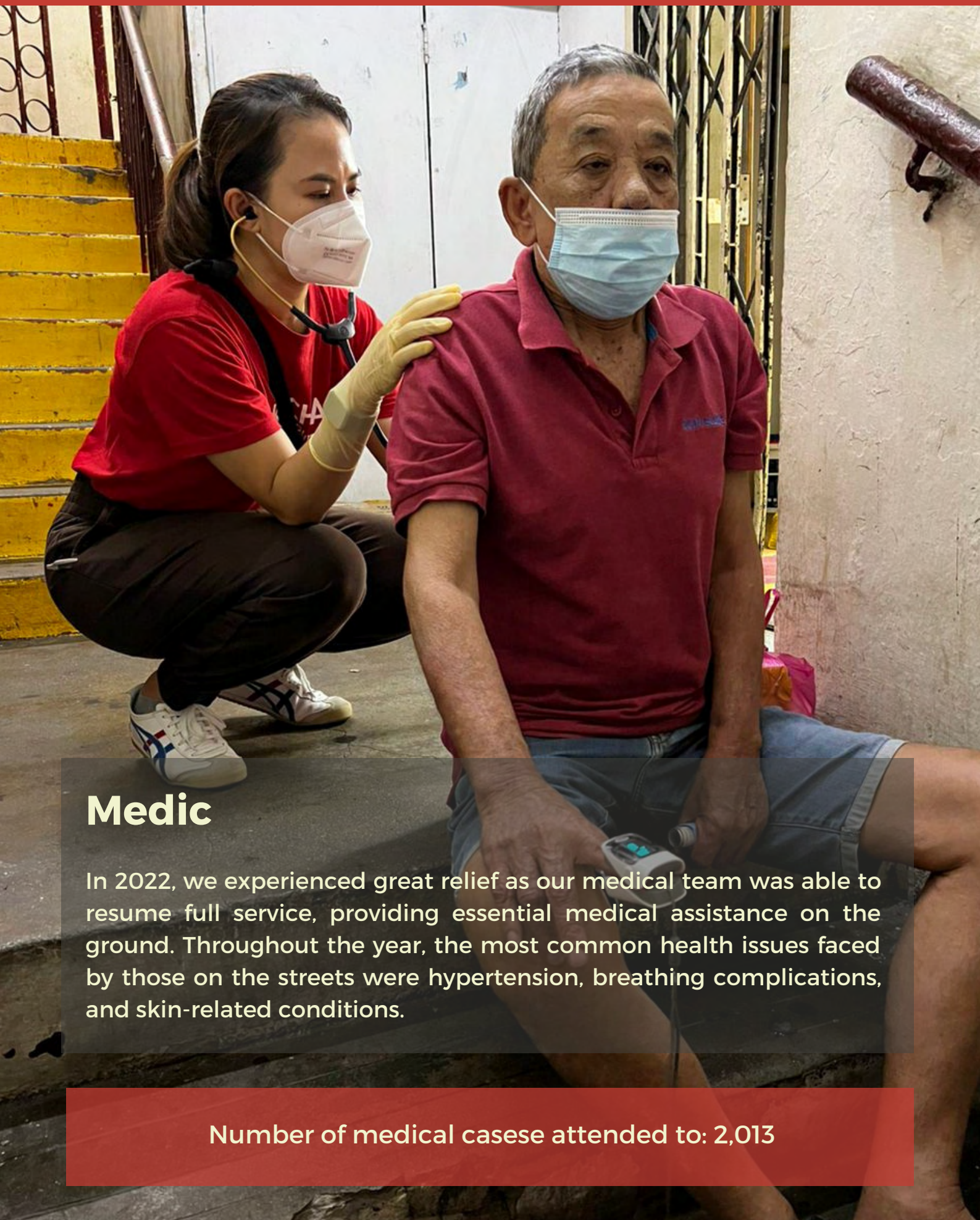

## Medic

In 2022, we experienced great relief as our medical team was able to resume full service, providing essential medical assistance on the ground. Throughout the year, the most common health issues faced by those on the streets were hypertension, breathing complications, and skin-related conditions.

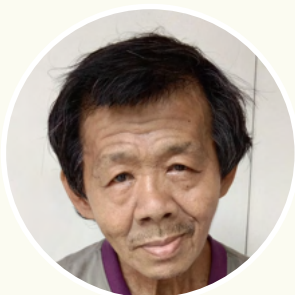
## Business as usual

Overall, in addition to our street rounds, the Kuala Lumpur team has resumed services at both the Medan Tuanku and Pudu stops, while the Johor Bahru team has been able to provide bi-monthly medical consultations to formerly homeless individuals staying in a halfway home as they wait to be reintegrated back into society.



## Added services in our Free Clinic in Imbi

As everything returns to normal, our partner organisation IMU Cares (International Medical University) has resumed its in-house dental and clinic services at our Soup Kitchen in Imbi. Other services, such as Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) and Chiropractic, were gradually added to our Free Clinic over the course of a year. These services are now available to both the homeless and urban poor clients.

## Welfare

As an organisation running a soup kitchen programme that goes beyond providing food, KSK Society is one of the few soup kitchens in Malaysia that provides its clients with consistent welfare assistance services, such as replacement of lost documents, job matching, rehoming, applying for monthly welfare financial aid, hospital follow-ups, and returning to hometowns.



Based on the depth of the result from previous years, we are inspired and remain committed to continuing to provide these essential services on the ground, not only to homeless individuals but also to urban poor families.

### Among the cases we attended to in 2022:

- Helped Uncle Foo from Sentul and En Rizkhi's family of six from Ipoh to avoid eviction.
- Temporarily sheltered a stranded couple with four children ranging from one to 12 years old in a halfway home in Anjung Singgah. They were eventually reintegrated back to their own hometown.
- Helped ex-client Abang 'A' repair his bicycle, which enabled him to report to work in his new job.
- Facilitated Mr. John in receiving his Covid-19 vaccination, which enabled him to secure a job.
- Assisted Uncle Khoo in obtaining medical certification and monthly financial welfare aid, which prevented him from eviction.
- Rehomed stranded Uncle Ng into a shelter.
- Provided humanitarian assistance to two of our unlucky charity partners: Pertubuhan Kebajikan Anak Yatim Mary when its orphanage was destroyed by fire, and K9 Cottage, which suffered huge losses after the devastating flood in Ulu Langat back in late December 2021.

## Food Bank

**Provide food security for the underprivileged community, through dry and surplus food assistance**

Since launching our food bank programme in 2012, KSK Society has focused on addressing issues of hunger, food insecurity, and social justice faced by needy families and individuals in both rural and urban areas by providing consistent food and basic necessities. Through our presence in 11 states, we have been able to locate, verify, and register those in need under our care, with the aim of preventing them from falling deeper into financial difficulties.

Number of families served regularly : 2,594 families

Food packs provided to needy families : 10,000 packs

Weight served in total : 172,224 kilogrammes



This year, the underprivileged have faced significant challenges such as increasing food prices, which have forced them to reduce their daily grocery budget to make ends meet. Many families are forced to contemplate sacrificing their children's education as essential expenses like rent, utilities, and food take precedence over other expenses. Thanks to the contributions of many kind-hearted Malaysians, KSK Society has been able to provide immediate short-term solutions to desperate families, ensuring they do not have to go to such extremes.

### Continuous Efforts to Help the Forgotten People in Taman Negara, Kuala Tahan

We have been consistently providing assistance to the Batek tribe in Taman Negara since 2020. In addition to food provisions, we have distributed basic necessities such as solar panels and tarpaulins to the 126 families residing in seven villages along the Tembeling river. Throughout the year, we have cultivated good friendships, which eventually led to us being granted permission to camp overnight in the village and socialise with them. We understand that food alone is not the ultimate solution to their predicament, and we aim to build on the newly formed trust to create more impactful work with them in the future.

### Food & School Mission, Helping The Forgotten

Following the successful Food Mission campaign in 2021, KSK Society embarked on a three-legged mission to deliver dry food assistance and school bags to 1,590 families residing in 34 villages throughout Peninsular Malaysia. We are grateful for the support given by our sponsors and volunteers, especially GD Express Sdn Bhd, for their invaluable assistance in transporting food to Chenderiang during the central leg. We remain committed to addressing the growing needs of this often-overlooked community, and the Food Mission campaign is a critical part of our ongoing efforts to assist them.

## Providing Essential Relief to Flood Victims of Baling, Kedah

In mid-July, a catastrophic flood struck Baling, Kedah, leaving many underprivileged families struggling to cope with the aftermath. With the help of local volunteers and team members from Penang, Kuala Lumpur, and Johor, we were able to provide essential aid to 200 underprivileged families living in scattered areas. This would not have been possible without the invaluable support of Mr. Teoh Swee Sun and CE Technology Berhad, for which we express our sincere gratitude.

## Feed A Family

The COVID-19 pandemic has had a significant impact on Malaysians, with 580,000 families slipping into the B40 group due to a loss of monthly income. As a result, there has been a greater need for food assistance for vulnerable communities, as they struggle to meet their basic needs amidst rising prices of goods. We are grateful for the donations received in 2022, which have enabled us to provide three months' worth of dry food provisions to a total of 97 needy families. Nevertheless, we need all the support we can get to continue helping more families in need on a regular basis, as we have been under tremendous pressure to meet the increased demand for food assistance.

## Be The Light

## Surplus Food Programme

KSK Society's surplus food programme has successfully diverted tens of tonnes of food waste from landfills and redirected it towards those in need. By doing so, KSK not only addresses hunger relief but also enables our partner to reduce their carbon footprint and put their valuable resources to good use. For KSK Society, it is crucial that we continue to ensure that surplus food is distributed to those who need it the most, such as those living in shelter homes, rehabilitation centres, orphanages, and nursing homes, where the cost of living has significantly increased.

Despite the challenges of rising operational costs and a lack of drivers, our team is committed to rescuing food daily to continue benefiting families and charity homes that often receive less support all over Malaysia. We believe that every little effort counts in addressing food waste and supporting vulnerable communities.

### New partnerships

In addition to our current food partners, KSK Society has established significant partnerships with AEON BiG and Pandamart. As we continue to expand our outreach, we recognise the significance of forming new partnerships to enhance the quantity, quality, frequency, and variety of food accessible for us to redistribute to those in need.

### #zerofoodwastage

The #zerofoodwastage campaign was launched in 2016 by Y.A.M. Tengku Zatashah (the Selangor Princess). It aims to reduce food wastage from hotel buffets by redistributing it to underprivileged communities. During the holy month of Ramadan, volunteers gather surplus cooked food from hotels and distribute it to charity homes and low-income families under our care. We express our sincere gratitude to the volunteers for their unwavering commitment to ensuring that food is not wasted but given to those in need. This year, with the help of dedicated volunteers, we were able to recover a total of 1,604 kilograms of surplus food from 20 hotels.

## Empowerment

Although food banks play a crucial role in addressing food insecurity, there are other cogs in a complex wheel that supports an individual to get out of poverty. In 2017, KSK Society launched the Empowerment programme aimed at helping low-income and unemployed individuals attain financial independence.

Over the years, trainees have acquired various skill sets such as sewing and baking, with the aim of breaking the cycle of poverty by empowering them with the necessary tools. Supporting their products is more than just a transaction; it is an opportunity to support their livelihoods and boost their confidence. In 2022, we have seen encouraging results from the Empowerment programme, giving us every reason to be excited for 2023. We extend our gratitude to everyone who has contributed to supporting our Empowerment programme.

### Sewing

The sewing department has successfully secured orders from Famous Amos and The Alice Smith School Foundation to create souvenirs using upcycled materials, providing valuable employment and income opportunities for the seamstresses. Mastering the skill of sewing is challenging, and compared to other training programmes, it requires additional patience and perseverance. As a result, the seamstresses have not only produced merchandise but also gained confidence in their abilities.



### Baking

Our baking department has been working tirelessly to fulfil orders, and our products have received high praise from customers for their well-balanced flavors. The team is continually exploring new ideas for creating fresh recipes, designing packaging for various occasions, and improving food quality to enhance marketability. One notable achievement has been the creation of our delectable Chocolate Chip Walnut Butter Cookies, which have become one of our best-selling cookie products.



"I first joined the Kechara Empowerment programme in 2020, to teach the trainees how to bake cookies. I'm now coming to the centre everyday and love training them, because they come with such a positive mindset. ## Mental health talk provided by Thrive Well Sdn Bhd

Mental health issues can affect anyone, but people living in poverty are especially vulnerable. The daily stresses of poverty such as food insecurity, unstable housing, and limited access to healthcare can have a significant impact on mental well-being. To address this issue, KSK Society partnered with Thrive Well Sdn Bhd to hold a mental health talk for the trainees in our Empowerment programme in November. This was the first talk of its kind by KSK Society, and 24 participants attended. A survey conducted after the event revealed that the majority found it to be beneficial.



The bakers and seamstresses who participate in the Empowerment programme express deep gratitude for the opportunity to learn new skills and earn extra income. For many of them, the programme has been a lifeline during these difficult times, as they have been hit hard by the pandemic. The income they earn through the programme has helped them to pay for essential expenses such as school fees and groceries. Moreover, by participating in the programme, they have not only developed their skills in sewing and baking but also their self-confidence, which is invaluable in their pursuit of greater things in life. The Empowerment programme has provided them with new hope and a sense of purpose, and they are grateful for the chance to be a part of it.



"Everything went upside down for me after my late husband died in an accident in 2009. I lost my job as a sales assistant during the lockdown and was having difficulty finding jobs due to my age and qualifications. I was very glad when my friend recommended me to KSK. They trained me up with baking skills and not long after, I was already earning about RM900 per month. I am a housewife taking care of my three children and disabled husband, who is an amputee and is suffering from diabetes and heart problems. I am the breadwinner of my family and was working as a part time cleaner when Covid-19 outbreak came. I lost my only source of income that left my family in a limbo. It was during that time when KSK approached me and subsequently enrolled me into its Empowerment programme. Now due to that, I am able to put food on the table and even have enough money for my children's schooling. I have an OKU wife and two adult children living on their own. I was reduced to being a freelance construction worker due to health and my wife's deteriorating condition. Then came the pandemic, it hit me so hard that I had problems maintaining my livelihood. There was nothing that I could do to make ends meet and I was very depressed up to a point of seeking medication from the hospital to keep it under control. It was during that time I was referred to KSK by a friend which I am very thankful of. Now, I am able to receive regular food provisions deliveries and earn a steady income from the Empowerment programme to pay for my other expenses. I love the flexibility of the work as I am able to make sure I have enough money and time to take care of my wife." **Soon, 59**
